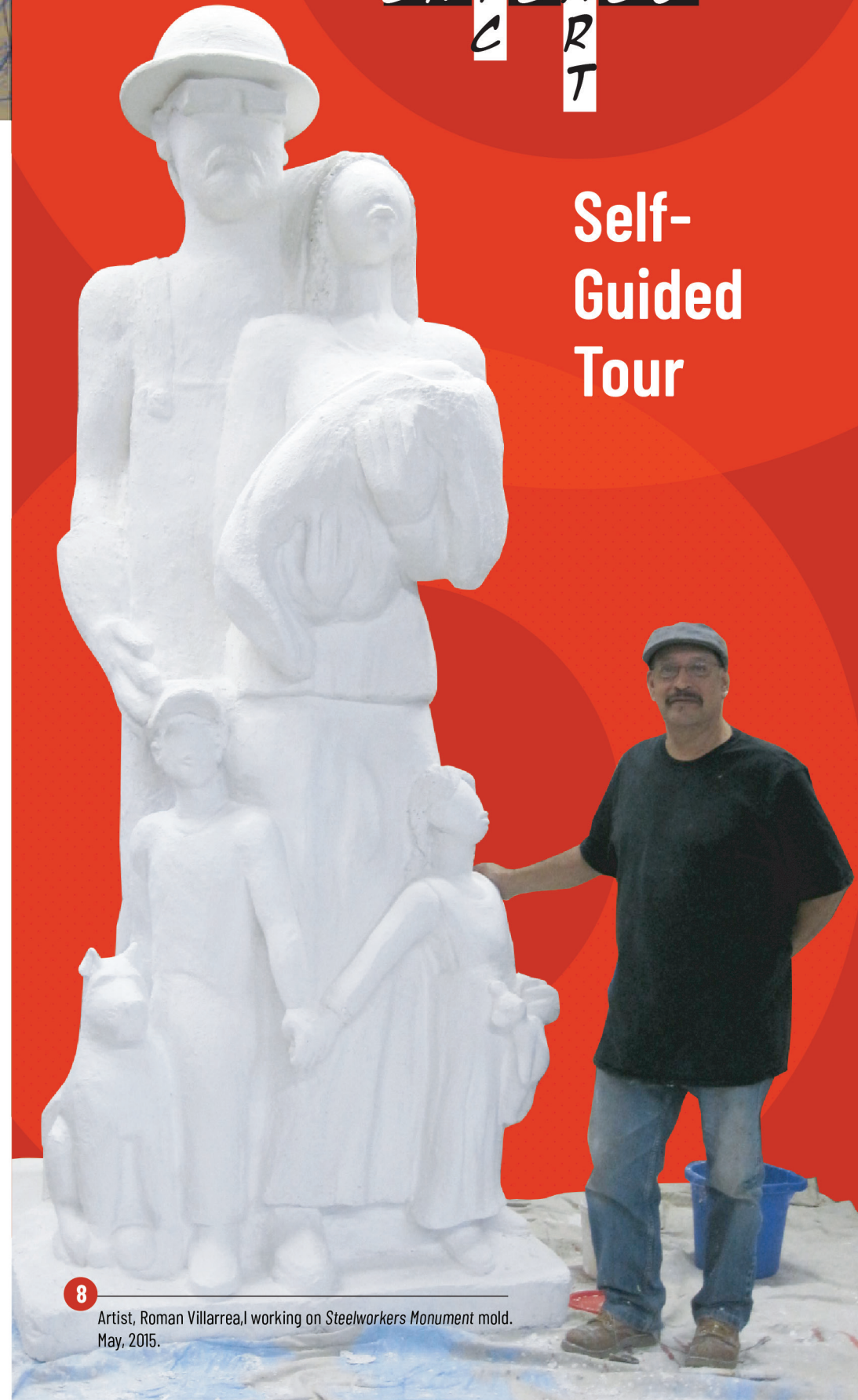

1. 79th and Exchange: drive-by art wall Derric Clemmons, Luz Castillo (Cocomocha) and friends, 2015
2. 79th and South Shore Drive: Richard Hunt's "The Steel Garden," 2013
3. 83rd St. and South Shore Drive NW corner: Drive-by art Derric and Luz, on-going
4. 8231 and South Shore Drive: St. Michael the Archangel Church: stained glass, statuary, architecture, 1892

9. 2710 E. 89th St., James H. Bowen High School. Dwight Perkins, architect, 1912. Houses Steel Mill and Calumet River mural by artist Vincent Mendoza, 1975
10. 8930 S. Muskegon, Henry Bessemer Park, Daniel Burnham architect, 1902. Murals on west side of field house.
11. 2944 E. 88th Street, Immaculate Conception Church, 1882
12. 3010 E. 88th St., Carolene's Heirloom Resale Boutique, facade by Derric Clemmons, 2015
13. 8933 S. Commercial Macias Produce, drive-by art on South wall of building by Derric Clemmons, 2015. Landmark plaque: George Elmslie facade.
14. 8947 S. Brandon, Artists Garden, initiated by South Chicago Art Center.
15. 90th and Commercial. World Sports/ PlayStreets Play Lot by Derric Clemmons.
16. 9001 S. Commercial, side of building, SEDCOM mural "South Chicago, We All Come Together as One" by noted Puerto Rican artist Gamaliel Ramirez with area students.
